In addition to her mediation and law practice, Mary Campbell is a teacher for University of California Extension's Conflict Resolution Certificate Program. Campbell teaches Introduction to Mediation, Facilitation and Community Engagement, and she previously taught Managing Community Conflict and a Theory-to-Practice seminar. Campbell worked at the University of California at Davis (UC Davis) where she was an analyst and facilitator. She also mediated for the U.S. Department of Agriculture through UC Davis Extension's Common Ground Center for Cooperative Solutions, working with ranchers, farmers, insurance companies and rural homeowners. She has worked with five community-based mediation centers in Maryland and California, mediating everything from family disputes to criminal charges.
